

## What Is Faith Promise?

**1.** Faith Promise missionary giving is just that.. a promise made **BY FAITH** by individual church members to give a certain amount of money to the missionary program of the church during the next twelve months.

**2.** The emphasis is upon **FAITH** in making the promise. This is giving **ABOVE** and **BEYOND** the regular tithes and offerings.. **by FAITH!**

**3.** Faith Promise is getting ahold of God. Each person seeks the Lord's direction **BY FAITH** as to what He would have them to give by **FAITH**.. trusting Him to supply it weekly. That person then purposes in his heart that he (or she) will give that amount each week **BY FAITH**. (II Corth. 9:7) This will do wonders for your prayer life! What a thrill it is to pray each time until the answer comes!

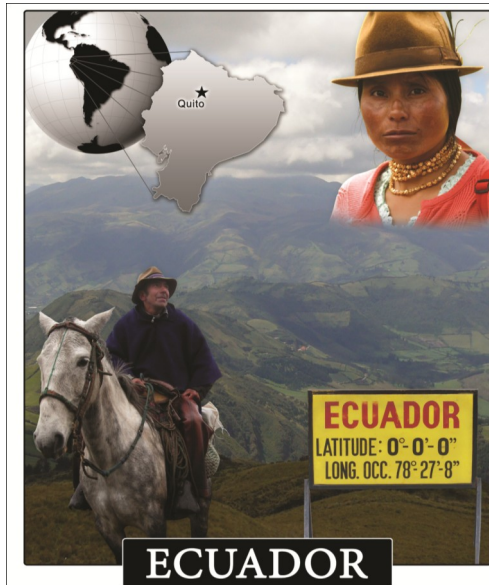
**4.** Faith Promise is between **YOU** and **GOD!** *IT IS NOT A PLEDGE, AND YOU WILL NOT BE DUNNED FOR IT.*

**5.** You mark a card.. but you do not sign it. No one knows what you mark individually but you and the Lord. It will be noted by different areas of the church as we try to reach a goal to do more this year for God.



### Andy and Amy Ragsdale

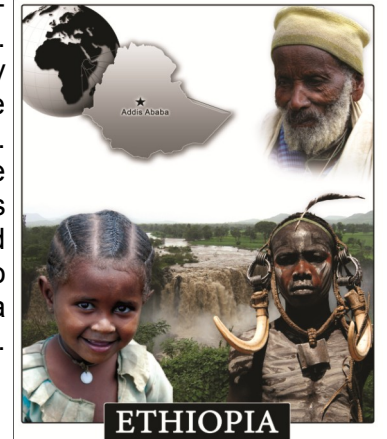

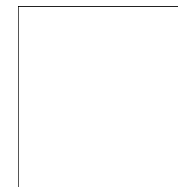

## How To Pray For Our Missionaries

1. Pray for essentials. It is not so essential to pray for good health. The important thing is that He give the missionary the measure of health that will glorify Him.
2. Do not pray that God will give the missionary an easy path. Rather that He might give them grace sufficient to be over comers for Him.
3. Do not pray so much that God will answer the missionaries' prayers as that God will keep them from being too busy to pray.
4. Pray that God will remove hindrances, or that in battling them He might give an unconquerable determination to go all the way with Him.
5. Pray that God censor, direct and bless their activities.
6. Do not pray for missionaries as though they were saints, living on a high level, simply because they are missionaries. They are subject to temptation. Satan determines to hinder their witness making it futile. Pray that God will give grace and strength to resist temptation.
7. Remember that missionaries, like everyone else, can become lonely, discouraged, irritable, sharp, and impatient. Much missionary work can be done without really being on fire for the Lord. Missionaries covet your prayers that they may live with their hearts aflame with compassion for the lost - aflame with the glory and love of Christ.

Eva was saved at age 4 through the ministry of a missionary while Eva's father was stationed in Germany. She has had a desire since then to be a missionary somewhere in Europe.

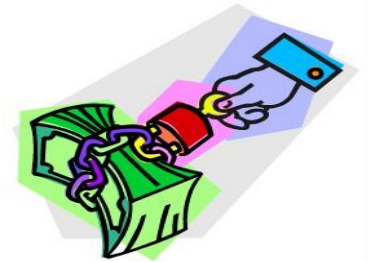
Doug and Eva met in church and, after about 15 months, announced to the church that they would be wed and then attend Baptist Bible College in Springfield, Missouri.
